START TALKING | (Find a conversation starter for your group)

Pastor Michael talked about the current state of the upcoming generation and the struggles our students and kids are facing. Did this surprise you? What can you do to help change these numbers? Did this information change how you feel about the next generation?

START EXPLORING | (Read the Bible)

Read Hebrews 6:17-20.

This passage lays out how extremely important it is for us to know the truth and be built on the hope that we find in Christ.

- What do you notice about the interaction of truth and hope in this passage?

START SHARING | (Choose a question to create openness)

Share about a time where you placed your hope in something and it failed you.

- What happened?
- How did this affect future decisions in your life?

This week we learned some ways you can be active in the life of a student.

- Can you think of other ways to engage and impact the student in your life?
- What is one thing you will do to be active in the life of our students?

Pastor Michael shared the importance of showing the next generation the absolute truth.

- What are some ways that we try to shield people from the truth?

Pastor Michael said, "What we place our hope in becomes the anchor for our lives."

- Where are some places that we place our hope?
- How can we be sure that we actually have an anchor and not a buoy?
- What is one step you can take this week to ensure that you are secured?
